Robert Plimmer added his name to the letter to save our NHS. Please contact Robert, or see our website, if you support our campaign for the British people to be given a second vote on Brexit.


Robert Plimmer's action to clean up Cippenham

1. In February, Cippenham campaigner Robert Plimmer noticed litter and fly-tipping in the footpath between **Eltham Ave and Richards Way**. He asked Slough Council what action they took to keep the area clean.
2. In March, Robert joined a small band of local people to take part in the Great British Spring Clean. He focused on the footpath he'd already asked the Council about keeping clean.
3. The photo (right) shows the rubbish he and another volunteer collected. **They also found a £5 note and credit and debit cards** that were handed over to the organiser.
4. In walking around Cippenham Meadows Robert also noticed several open and messy utility boxes: see back page for the action he took on this.

Robert has asked the Council to demand action from utility companies over exposed boxes.


Those he has reported this year include boxes in: **Frogmore Close** (see left); **Keel Drive**; **Mitchell Close**; **Raleigh Close**; and two in **Telford Drive**.

Information comes from local residents and from Robert's own walks around Cippenham Meadows.

Please replace the gate, Robert repeatedly asked

In Autumn 2017 a local resident reported to Robert that the Council had been slow in replacing a gate at the entrance to **Mercian Recreation Ground in Moor Furlong**. (See right).

Action was promised, but it was still not done by February, so Robert repeated the request. He was told it would be done.

Why should Robert Plimmer be Cippenham Meadows next councillor

1. He has lived in our ward (at Weekes Drive) for 20 years; and works year-round for our community.
2. Robert would stand up for local residents against the ruling Labour Group on Slough Council when they: refuse to listen to residents (eg on traffic issues); run services such as those for children so badly that central Government has to take over; & increase charges for hiring sports pitches so much that many stop hiring them.
